1. What is the NCAA Clearing House?

- Reviews academic records, test scores and amateur status to ensure conformity with NCAA rules.

2. When Should You Register?

- There is no deadline. NCAA recommends at the beginning of Jr. year. Most register at the end of Jr. year. It must be complete before they receive an athletic scholarship or compete at a Division 1 or 2 institution.

3. Records the Clearinghouse Requires?

- HS Transcript after six (6) semesters of High School.
- Transcript must be sent directly from the High School.
- Test score(s) sent directly to the Clearinghouse.

4. Registration Fee

- One-Time Fee of $\$ 65$.

5. Fee Waiver

- Students who have received a waiver for the SAT or ACT are eligible for a waiver of the clearinghouse registration fee. The student's counselor must submit confirmation of the student's test fee waiver.

## Core Requirements

- The NCAA allows 1 core class ( 0.5 credits) to be made up immediately after graduation (up to 1 yr.) for eligibility purposes.


## DIVISION I

16 Core Courses (48H):
4 years of English.
3 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher).


2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).
1 year of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.
2 years of social science.
4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrinal religion/philosophy).

## NCAA Academic Eligibility Requirements

-Complete a certain number of core classes.
-Earn a certain minimum GPA in these core courses.

- Earn a certain minimum score on the SAT or ACT (Scaled based upon core GPA)
-Graduate from High School
