You can be the best player in the country, but if you don't qualify you will not go to a four year college out of high school on a scholarship or be eligible to compete as a freshman!

Clearinghouse

1. What is the NCAA Clearing House?
 - Reviews academic records, test scores and amateur status to ensure conformity with NCAA rules.
2. When Should You Register?
 - There is no deadline. NCAA recommends at the beginning of Jr. year. Most register at the end of Jr. year. It must be complete before they receive an athletic scholarship or compete at a Division 1 or 2 institution.
3. Records the Clearinghouse Requires?
 - HS Transcript after six (6) semesters of High School.
 - Transcript must be sent directly from the High School.
 - Test score(s) sent directly to the Clearinghouse.

4. Registration Fee

- One-Time Fee of \$65.

5. Fee Waiver

- Students who have received a waiver for the SAT or ACT are eligible for a waiver of the clearinghouse registration fee. The student's counselor must submit confirmation of the student's test fee waiver.

Do you want to play NCAA Division I or II sports? Great!

You should only complete this registration process if you plan to participate in NCAA Division I or II collegiate athletics. If you plan to participate in Division III athletics, contact the college or university for eligibility requirements.

Registering for the NCAA Clearinghouse

5. To finish the application you will need a VISA or MasterCard credit card.
6. Cost to register with the clearinghouse is \$50.00
7. If you do not have access to a credit card you can print out the form from the computer or pick it up from your school's athletic counselor.
8. Must be registered with the clearinghouse before you can be eligible to compete at any NCAA institution.

Core Requirements

- You will be required to have 16 Core Courses (48H)



Core Requirements

- The NCAA allows 1 core class (0.5 credits) to be made up immediately after graduation (up to 1 yr.) for eligibility purposes.



DIVISION I

16 Core Courses (48H):

4 years of **English**.

3 years of **mathematics** (Algebra I or higher).

2 years of **natural/physical science** (1 year of lab if offered by high school).

1 year of additional **English, mathematics** or **natural/physical science**.

2 years of **social science**.

4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrinal religion/philosophy).



NCAA Academic Eligibility Requirements

- Complete a certain number of core classes.
- Earn a certain minimum GPA in these core courses.
- Earn a certain minimum score on the SAT or ACT (Scaled based upon core GPA)
- Graduate from High School

Section-1

Section-4
