## ADMISSION \& FEES

Classes are free of charge and open to any adult resident living in the Barstow area. High school students may be enrolled provided space is available. Concurrent enrollment of high school students is voluntary. A signed permission slip from the high school counselor and parent is required.

## REGISTRATIONS

Registrations begin January 11, 2016, in Room 60 at Barstow High School. Please call ahead to ensure that the staff is available. New students who seek a high school diploma will need to bring an official copy of high school and/or college transcript. Classes with fewer than 15 students are subject to cancellation.

## DIPLOMA

Students shall receive a diploma and may participate in the graduation ceremony once the State of California and Barstow Unified School District's graduation requirements have been fulfilled. Since the 2005/2006 school year, students who seek a diploma of high school graduation will be required to successfully pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE), offered free of charge.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Pass Calif. High School Exit Exam
- Residency requirements of $\mathbf{1 5}$ units


## ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is a requirement for all classes. Adult absences in excess of 12 hours per semester may result in the student being dropped. Concurrently enrolled high school students may not miss more than 2 absences per class. Courses are a semester in length of 18 weeks. Five (5) units of credit are given for each class when a passing grade is received; provided enrollment occurs no later than the regular enrollment period/academic deadline.
